2016-2017 BIENNIAL REPORT

ROLES OF THE COMMISSION

- 1. Advise the Board of Supervisors on all matters affecting senior citizens and make recommendations to the County Administrative Officer and the Board of Supervisors on any senior citizens program proposal to be considered by the Board of Supervisors.
- 2. Review the needs of senior citizens in the county, and develop a set of comprehensive goals and objectives for effectively meeting those needs.
- 3. Monitor the various services made available to senior citizens by public and private agencies in Santa Cruz County to ensure efficient delivery of those services.
- 4. Communicate with federal and state agencies and commissions serving senior citizens, and assist in the preparation, implementation and review of any regional plan or program designed to serve senior citizens.

MEETING DATES, TIMES AND LOCATIONS

Seniors Commission meetings were held on the third Tuesday of every other month (February, April, June, August, and October) from 1:30 p.m. to 3:30 p.m. at the Regional Transportation Commission offices at 1523 Pacific Avenue, Santa Cruz or the County Government Center at 701 Ocean Street.

In August of 2017 the Commission held a day long Retreat at the United Way of Santa Cruz County. Items covered during the Retreat included the history of the Commission, Commissioner duties and responsibilities, past activities and brainstorming of goals for 2018 - 2019.

The Seniors Commission is composed of ten voting members, two appointed by each of the five Supervisors. There is one ex officio member representing the California Senior Legislature (CSL). The Commissioners as of December 31, 2017 were:

ACCOMPLISHMENTS FOR 2016-2017

I. Seniors Services

The Commission heard reports from Community Agencies, County programs and other interested entities:

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Commissioners attended and participated in many community meetings that focus on or relate to issues affecting Seniors. Commissioner Childers is a Meal Site Manager for Meals on Wheels, a former Board member for the Alzheimer's Association, and a volunteer baker who bakes free birthday cakes for underserved populations within the community. Commissioner Childers also participates in Senior Roundtables, the Seniors Council, and the Commission on Long-Term Care. Commissioner Sones is the Program Director for Elderday, and she participates in the Seniors Roundtable and serves on the IHSS Advisory Commission. Commissioner De la Torre participates in AARP, the Human Care Alliance and goes to board meetings at her senior mobile home park. Commissioner Lewis regularly attends the Mobile and Manufactured Commission meetings and provides relevant updates to the Commission. Commissioner Walters is an active volunteer driver for Gray Bears. Commissioner McKibbin serves on the Board of Directors for the Retired Public Employees Association and is active in the Homeless Garden Project. Commissioner Tuosto serves on the Area Agency on Aging Advisory Council.

Commissioners assisted the Seniors Council in distributing senior needs assessments surveys through Gray Bears in geographical locations such as the San Lorenzo Valley to ensure adequate representation throughout the County.

The Commission endorsed the 2017 Solutions Summit that the Seniors Council held in October. Multiple Commissioners participated in the Summit and are continuing to be engaged in work groups that have emerged from the Summit and provide updates on these at Commission meetings.

II. Senior Housing

Mark Trabing with Habitat for Humanity discussed a new pilot program- ADUs (Accessory Dwelling Units) for seniors that are on limited incomes within the City of Santa Cruz. He distributed brochures titled "The Keys to Aging in Place" that provide information about this pilot program.

The Commission also began to discuss aging in place laws and regulations at their Retreat and recently began exploring age friendly communities.

III. Transportation

The Commission wrote a support letter to the Board of Supervisors for the Regional Transportation Commission's Transportation Improvement Plan (TRIP) with maximized

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funding for essential services for seniors.

Multiple Commissioners attended Metro hearings in 2016 to advocate for senior services.

Commissioner Levine continued efforts to get low income and vulnerable populations free to low cost transportation.

IV. Legislative Review

A. Charles Molnar, member of the California Senior Legislature (CSL), participated in the Seniors Commission as an ex officio member and provided reports on the progress of the CSL top priorities and provided information on the legislative committee hearings on Senior legislation.

V. Nutrition

A. The Commission wrote a support letter to Governor Brown for Seniors Nutrition Funding.

VI. Advocacy

- A. The Commission wrote a support letter to Senator Todd regarding SB 202 which will increase the personal needs allowance for Medi-Cal eligible individuals living in institutional settings from \$35 a month to \$80.
- B. Commissioners met with their Supervisor to advocate for amending the Elder Abuse and Dependent Adult Civil Protection Act.
- C. Commissioners wrote a support letter regarding Financial Elder Abuse (SP-7) to the Board.
- D. Commissioners wrote a support letter to maintain funding for the State Health Insurance and Assistance Program (HICAP) to the Board.
- E. Commissioners wrote to Senator Mitchell and Assemblyman Joaquin Arambula urging them to support the CSL Temporary Funding Request and Carryover Request.

VII. Bylaw Amendments

A. The Commission approved proposed amendments to their by-laws in December 2017.

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VIII. Outreach

- A. Commissioners actively recruited to fill vacancies on the Commission. In person orientations were provided to new Commissioners to enhance their efficacy and understanding of the Commission and their role.
- B. The Commission updated their brochure.

FUTURE GOALS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- The Commission will perform outreach and advocacy activities within the community through participating in local events relating to the purpose and scope of the Commission to increase visibility of the Commission and awareness of issues that impact seniors.
- The Commissioners will engage with elected officials at least once annually to create an ongoing dialogue about the challenges and issues that impact seniors through letters, emails, scheduling meetings with their District's Supervisor, and inviting the Supervisors' participation in senior events.
- Promoting "Age Friendly Communities" will be the primary priority and area of focus for the Commission's activities over the next two years, with various related sub-issues being addressed through sub-committee projects and events, including Housing, Transportation, Public Guardianship, Age in Place Laws, and End of Life Issues. The Commission endeavors to enhance the public's awareness of these issues as they relate to seniors through improved communication, coordination, and collaborations with local organizations and agencies to maximize the impact of their advocacy efforts through collective action and to minimize redundant activities.

The Seniors Commission reviewed this annual report at its meeting on December 19, 2017.
